

Digital Health Hub in Erlangen/Nürnberg is an internationally leading cluster within the area of medtech and is also called "Medical Valley". The network unites 500 companies, 80 research groups and universities and over 60 hospitals with focus on digital health.

Christina Schmidt-Holtmann studied law and used to work with data protection issues. Since 2013 she works at the Federal Ministry of Economics and Energy at the department for digital and innovation politics. She presents the start-up politics of the ministry.

Senior Government Official (Regierungsdirektor) Andreas Hartl is Head of Division VI B 2 (Economic issues oft he Digital Agenda and social developments, digital sovereignty). In 2012 he started working at the BMWi, at first with telecommunications, competitive and regulatory issues of digitisation and since 2017 as head of Division for VI B2. His team published several papers such as the "Greenbook" and the "Whitebook" for digital platforms, which are part of the German Digital Strategy 2025. He presents the Digital Health Hub and its roll in the German and international e-health context.
